# Lack of qualified candidates resulted in no scholarship offered for 2018

This scholarship program is serious about creating results. We therefore have a set of criteria that the successful candidate must...

- have demonstrated a strong interest in and commitment to sustainable agricultural and/or forestry practices,
- is committed to protecting and preserving our natural resources and related economic and social conditions,
- have strong communication skills andpossess leadership characteristics.

Upon receiving two applications this year the Rochester Area Foundation recommendation was to not award. Our three independent reviewers concurred. Here is their comment:

"We have to say we are not very impressed by these two applications. Neither displays the depth of understanding and passion for ecology and sustainability we have seen previously. Writing skills and research experience are also lacking. We don't see the work experience, volunteer involvement, or coursework that suggest a commitment to a career in some aspect of sustainability. Based on what we've seen so far, we would conserve our resources for another year."

## An Interview With One of Our Strong Supporters

Bob Manross is a significant donor to the Scholarship Endowment Fund even though he does not live in this area any more. We set out to ask him why and to understand his motivations.

"I grew up in Iowa, graduated from Iowa State University and couldn't

get out of Iowa fast enough. But now that I am retired and have time to think things over, I find that I appreciate my roots. I want to give something back. I like grassroots organizations that seek to restore the damage we have done to nature, and where my donated money, all of it, goes to building endowments. I want to support organizations with a lasting impact. That led me to the Leopold Center for Sustainable Agriculture in Iowa, and the Sustainable Agriculture & Forestry Scholarship Endowment Fund in Minnesota.

"I picked these two organizations because Leopold Center research clearly shows that to "feed the world" we need to change our ways. Leopold testing shows all the benefits of soil that is free of pesticides and fertilizer inputs. Healthy soil that regenerates itself is our future. Soil that is full of biological life is high in organic matter, oxygen, carbon and water—all fundamental to our life on earth—and recreates an environmentally sustainable society. We owe it to the younger generations to leave them with something that will support them, that is healthy, that is sustainable.

"After having spent 40+ years in the environmental field—contributing to creating clean and safe water—I appreciate that to be sustainable something has to go on in perpetuity. How far can we push the soil? How long before we have another dust storm like the 1930s? We continue to install drain-fields and to send large volumes of deadly chemicals down the rivers. We might create a tragedy from which we cannot recover. We have experienced 50 years of abnormally good weather. The future could be 50 years of abnormally bad weather. We plan at best for 10 year futures. Nature works in longer cycles. The curves changed dramatically after the industrial revolutions. We have exceeded our historical upper limits of CO2 in the atmosphere as we experience dramatic climate changes. After all, soil is the great carbon sequesterer. We released

carbon from the soil. It is time to return it to the soil."

We asked Bob if he could describe ideal candidates for the Scholarships and if he had a wish for what these students will accomplish.

"They have a big job ahead of them to practice their field and to be vocal advocates. To build broad networks of contacts, to teach and to learn. They must be passionate, to be committed to work in their chosen fields and to have high integrity.

The measure of life's success too often is the accumulation of wealth. I feel that is a poor measure. We need to find a new measure that leaves us and our society better off —or at least not worse off. I feel a sense of urgency. We must act. We have the data but most are not willing to change. We must change.

RAF, a 501 (c)(3) Foundation, is accredited by National Standards for operational quality, donor service and accountability in the community foundation sector. RAF's administrative fees are 1.25% of the annual fund balance and are amply covered by RAF's investment performance.

Neither scholarships nor fees are reducing the endowment equity!

The Founders issue and mail periodic newsletters. The costs of which they cover without reducing the endowment equity.
